COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

Madison, Nebraska

January 22, 2020

The Board of County Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 9:30 P.M.

Advance notice of meeting was published in the Thursday, January 16, 2020, edition of The Norfolk Daily News and posted on the Madison County website. A copy of said notice was provided to each Board member. An affidavit of acknowledgment of receipt of notice of meeting as published was executed.

Following a moment of Silence and the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, Chairman Troy Uhlir called the meeting to order and notified the public of the copy of the Open Meetings Act posted in the meeting room. Present: Commissioners Christian Ohl, Ron Schmidt, and Troy Uhlir, County Clerk Anne Pruss, and County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson. Norfolk Daily News reporter Jerry Guenther and US92 reporter Cody Ronfeldt were present until 10:25 a.m.

Commissioner Ohl read the following consent agenda items into the record:

- 1) Approval of minutes of January 7, 2020, meeting
- 2) Acknowledge receipt of the Official Bond of Leah A. Barrett as President of Northeast Community College
- 3) Approve appointment of Gene Walker as a member of Norfolk Area Visitors Bureau, term beginning January 2020
- 4) Approval of Michelle Kroupa for providing cleaning services for the Madison County Extension and Veterans' Service offices
- 5) Approval of purchase of motor grader in the amount of \$253,851.00 from Murphy Tractor & Equipment, Sioux City, Iowa, for Road District #2

Motion was made by Ohl and seconded by Schmidt to approve the consent agenda. Roll call vote: Ayes, Ohl, Schmidt, Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schmidt read the regular agenda into the record. Motion was made by Schmidt and seconded by Ohl to approve the regular agenda. Roll call vote: Ayes, Ohl, Schmidt, Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Authorization to continue the office of County Surveyor as an elected position and to not submit the question to the registered voters was then addressed. County Clerk Anne Pruss stated that NACO informed the county about the State statute, with a decision regarding this by the deadline of February 1, 2020. Chairman Uhlir opened the public hearing at 9:34 A.M. County Surveyor LaVern Schroeder spoke in favor of the County Surveyor remaining an elected position. He stated that duties and term would be remain the same either way. He also believed it would set a dangerous precedent to change this to an appointed position as it takes away the right of the people to vote. Mr. Schroeder stated that his Surveyor duties include maintaining all of the section corners and quarter sections corners the government set in the 1860s and 1870s. He stated that Madison County has very good records, which a lot of counties do not have. He stated that doing a survey is very costly for the general public because monuments have not been perpetuated and basically have been graded out on the road systems. The State passed legislation that states that the only person allowed to set a government corner, which is a section corner or quarter section corner set by the original government surveyors, is the County Surveyor. He stated it is a real value to the County because this is what taxes are based upon.

Chairman Uhlir asked how often corners are being surveyed with Mr. Schroeder stating it is being done all the time. Commissioner Schmidt stated that most of the section quarters should be staked, and Mr. Schroeder stated that the markers get graded out frequently, and they have to go back to find them. Commissioner Schmidt asked if the County is charged when the Surveyor does that. Mr. Schroeder stated that the County is charged if it is in the County road system, which was a decision made by the State's Attorney General. Mr. Schroeder described other costs the County would incur if the Surveyor were an appointed position. The commissioners stated they were trying to do what is best for the County, which requires them to become more familiar with the Surveyor's responsibilities and what the County is paying for as well as the costs above and over the position.

Commissioner Schmidt asked Mr. Schroeder if he could provide any numbers regarding how many times he goes out in a month or annually. He stated that in the wintertime it isn't as often, but that they were doing this more in the spring through the fall. Mr. Schroeder did not have that information at the time but stated he would try to provide it. When asked if the County pays for some of his equipment, Mr. Schroeder stated that the County does not pay for it but is charged a fee for using it.

County Clerk Anne Pruss stated that the decision needs to be made by February 1, 2020. The Board stated they were trying to be fiscally responsible for the County and had no complaints regarding Mr. Schroeder's work. Mrs. Pruss stated there have been no complaints about Mr. Schroeder not doing his job from the State or the citizens.

County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson stated he would like to see this remain an elected position. He stated that regardless of whether it is an elected or appointed position, the work will be the same. He stated that if it is an appointed position, the County would have to decide if that is a part-time position, as it is now, or a full-time appointed position. Chairman Uhlir asked Mr. Johnson if he thought the County would lose its priority with an appointed position. Mr. Johnson stated that the County Surveyor has requirements he has to follow that are set by law, mainly setting section borders and keeping records, which the surveyor would need to do whether appointed or elected. Mr. Johnson did state that if a consultant is appointed, the consultant would have other work to schedule around.

No one spoke in opposition.

The public hearing was closed at 9:55 a.m.

After discussion, the following resolution was presented:

RESOLUTION #2020-4

RESOLUTION TO ELECT COUNTY SURVEYOR

A RESOLUTION TO CONTINUE TO PROVIDE FOR THE LAWFUL CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT OF THE PUBLIC FOR THE ELECTION OF A COUNTY SURVEYOR BY THE REGISTERED VOTERS OF THE COUNTY IN MADISON COUNTY, NEBRASKA

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute § 32-525 states that If a county having a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand inhabitants has an elected county surveyor in office on January 1, 2020, the county board may, prior to February 1, 2020, following a public hearing, adopt a resolution to continue to elect the county surveyor for the county; and

WHEREAS, the population of Madison County is less than one hundred fifty thousand inhabitants according to the most recent official United State Census; and

WHEREAS, as of January 1, 2020 the office of County Surveyor of Madison County is currently held by a duly elected official; and

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2020, the Board of Supervisors of Madison County, held a public hearing at its regular meeting upon publication of notice of the same in the legal newspaper in the county to hear public comment and discuss the issue; and

WHEREAS, Article IX, Section 4 of the Nebraska Constitution provides for the election of necessary county officers to be chosen by the voters.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the election of county officers is a right of the public and shall be protected in accordance with the Nebraska Constitution and the office of County Surveyor shall remain as an elected office to be chosen by the majority of votes cast by the registered voters of Madison County, Nebraska at each general election of the county and the question of electing a County Surveyor shall not be submitted to the registered voters of the county at the statewide general election in 2020.

Motion was made by Ohl and seconded by Schmidt to approve Resolution #2020-4. Roll call vote: Ayes, Ohl, Schmidt, Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

The communication upgrade CAT6 cabling for the new phone system is the next item of discussion. Chairman Uhlir stated that one of the biggest issues the County has had is trying to find someone to tell us what we need for a phone system. He reached out to RVW of Columbus. The first thing they asked when they came in to evaluate the Courthouse was where the switch panel was and is there a diagram map. To Chairman Uhlir's knowledge, the Courthouse has none of that. RDW has been asked to put a proposal together to come in to do the engineering work for the Courthouse, doing a site audit, preparing of plans and specs, and to do a CAD4 plan. They would also assist with the pre-bid meeting, reviewing of bids, and the final inspection once a provider has been chosen. Mr. Uhlir stated that the County is trying to do a VOIP system, which would be phones over the internet. He stated that currently, the phones are plugged into terminals, but we may not be satisfied with the new phone system if we don't have wiring to each station. The goal is to run two CAT6 cables to each workstation. The price for the contract with RDW would be \$12,900.

Another thing to consider is the County Automation System. Presently, the Courts, Dispatch, and the Treasurer's office all feed off the secure line, and the speed has been an issue for the radio system. This upgrade would create better efficiencies in those offices.

Chairman Uhlir stated that he thought putting in a phone system without upgrading and reengineering the underlying support would be like putting the cart before the horse.

Motion was made by Schmidt and seconded by Ohl to approval RVWs proposal for the CAT6 work to be done with the understanding that the County would own the mapping and other parts of their work. Roll call vote: Ayes, Ohl, Schmidt, Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Mr. Johnson discussion the right-of-way acquisition on 841st Road between Sections 30 and 31, Township 24 North, Range 2 West. County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson stated he is fairly optimistic that the County is close to an agreement with the landowners. He stated that a ditch would not work, and there would probably need to be more culverts. He stated that one of the landowners said that water goes over the road frequently, meaning there is the need for different culverts or more culverts. He stated that a hydrology study would not be of benefit. Mr. Johnson stated that the paperwork is ready. He stated that the County will be paying \$10,000 an acre for the right-of-way but the county already has 33 feet of right-of-way. The acquisition cost will be approximately \$5,500. It was noted that fences and power poles would also need to be moved. No action was taken.
