Chairman Lee Klein called the meeting to order and notified the public of the location of the information regarding the Open Meeting Act posted in the meeting room.

Present: Commissioners Jerry McCallum, Rick Uhlir, and Lee Klein, County Assessor Jeff Hackerott, County Treasurer Donna Primrose, and County Clerk Nancy Scheer.

Motion was made by Uhlir and seconded by McCallum to approve the agenda for the meeting. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCallum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Uhlir and seconded by McCallum to approve the minutes of the meeting held on February 3, 2009. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCallum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.

The Board of County Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska met in regular session at 9:30 A.M.

Advance notice of meeting was published in the Thursday, February 12, 2009 edition of The Norfolk Daily News. A copy of said notice was mailed to each Board member. Chairman McCallum called the meeting to order and notified the public of the location of the information regarding the Open Meeting Act posted in the meeting room.

Present: Commissioners Jerry McCallum, Rick Uhlir, and Lee Klein, and County Clerk Nancy Scheer. County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson joined the meeting at 9:56 A.M. County Attorney Joseph Smith was present from 9:58 A.M. to 10:08 A.M. and Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson was present from 10:08 A.M. to 10:27 A.M.

Motion was made by Klein and seconded by Uhlir to approve the consent agenda. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCallum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Klein and seconded by Uhlir to approve the regular agenda. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCallum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed the following reports and correspondence:

- 7) Letter from the Nebraska Jail Standards Division regarding evaluation of the Madison County Jail and compliance with the minimum jail standards

County Clerk Nancy Scheer reported that one application was received to complete the unexpired term of office for the Madison County Weed District Board member due to the vacancy created by the resignation of Delbert Meisinger. She reported that the applicant was Myron "Mike" Nelson, who is the process of moving to 206 North 1st Street in the City of Newman Grove.

After discussion, it was moved by Uhlir and seconded by Klein to appoint Myron "Mike" Nelson as a member of the Madison County Weed District Board to complete the term of office that ends on January 5, 2011. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCollum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.

County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson submitted a copy of the section of the Code of Federal Regulations regarding Conflicts of Interest and reported that the regulations state that "No engineer, attorney, appraiser, inspector or other person performing services for a State or a governmental instrumentality in connection with a project shall have, directly or indirectly, a financial or other personal interest, other than his employment or retention by a State or other governmental instrumentality, in any contract or subcontract in connection with such project." He stated that the Nebraska Department of Road's interpretation of this regulation, with the encouragement of the Federal Highway Administration, is that the same engineer can't complete both the design work and construction engineering aspect of a project, and in his opinion, this is a poor policy. In addition, he reported that he heard that the federal government is not mandating enforcement of this regulation, but they are strongly encouraging enforcement of it. Mr. Johnson stated, that is his opinion, there isn't a conflict of interest if the same engineer completes both the design work and construction engineering for a project.

Commissioner Klein stated that if this regulation interpretation is adopted, a contractor couldn't also serve as a construction manager because he would have a vested interest in the project. County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson reported that another portion of the regulation provides that it would be the responsibility of the state to enforce the requirements of this section. He explained that most of the highway superintendents interpret this regulation to mean that the state makes the final decision and the federal government is using poor justification to try to convince the state to enforce this regulation. In addition, he explained that the Nebraska Department of Roads is saying that the regulation only affects cities and counties and not the state department, so they are willing to do whatever the federal government wants.

Commissioner Uhlir questioned if the federal government was threatening the state department of roads by withholding funds. County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson responded that the federal government could threaten all they want; however, in his opinion, they can't withhold any funds.

Chairman McCallum stated that he would contact Congressman Fortenberry and inquire if he could assist the counties with the problem. County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson responded that Congressman Fortenberry is aware of this situation. He explained that he is trying to educate the County Board members regarding this situation and he plans to request support from the County Board. He stated that the Nebraska Department of Roads plans to have these regulations adopted by March 9, 2009 so counties must act quickly. Mr. Johnson explained that the Nebraska Department of Roads would not make the regulations available for review until they are adopted and approved by the Federal Highway Administration. He stated that if this happens the counties won't have any chance for input. He also reported that it is less difficult to prevent something from becoming a rule than to change the rule once it has been adopted.

Chairman McCallum questioned how to get the representatives at the federal level to assist with delaying adoption of the regulations. County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson responded that County Boards across the state should contact the Nebraska Association of County Officials Executive Director Larry Dix and the Governor explaining that adoption of these regulations would put a real hardship on the counties, that it is a poor interpretation, and to request the Nebraska Department of Roads to deny adoption of the regulations.

Commissioner Klein reported that Senator Mike Flood stated that the Governor is the person who can stop adoption of these regulations. County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson concurred and reported that no progress has been made with the Nebraska Department of Roads. In summary, he stated that he composed a resolution and would like the Board to act on it at the next meeting. He reported that the counties must act quickly on this matter because adoption of the regulation would cause a lot of hardship for the counties.

County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson explained that if the county gets a federal aid job and has one engineer complete the design work and another engineer oversee the construction, which one would be responsible when there is a problem. He stated that the construction engineer would blame the design engineer stating that the problem is a design error and the design engineer would blame the construction engineer stating that the project was staked incorrectly. He explained that the county then must decide which engineer is at fault. He explained that if the same engineer completes both the design and construction staking, there is no question about who is at fault if there is a problem.

The Board took no action.

Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson was present to discuss a proposed change to email and website addresses. He reported that the county officials have expressed an interest to change the county domain to a .gov name. He explained that the current domain name of co.madison.ne.us is complicated. He stated that the change to a .gov domain name would require the county to submit an application to the federal government and the process is complicated. He stated that the application requires three points of contact, one person to guarantee payment, one person to administrate the domain, and a technical person. He reported that the county could also consider another domain name, such as .com, .org, .net, .tv, or .biz, which cost between \$5 and \$35 annually. He explained that the current domain name is free, but a domain name with a .gov extension costs \$125 annually. He reported that the domain name through with a .gov extension must be madisoncounty-ne.gov. Mr. Johnson explained that after the domain name is changed, the email addresses could also be changed to the same configuration. He reported that both domain addresses would be active for a period of time, especially since the current domain name is free of charge. He explained that keeping both domain names active would make it easier for people to access the county website.

Commissioner Uhlir questioned if the county benefits by changing the domain name. Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson responded that changing the domain simplifies the name for users. He explained that there is also a fee to change to the domain name to .org or .com. He stated that the county has limitations with the .gov domain because the naming configuration must reflect the government name, what type of government entity is involved, and the state. He explained that the only abbreviation that could be used is the state's name. In addition, he reported that other abbreviations are available that could be used with the .org or .com domain. Mr. Johnson reported that the State of Nebraska has changed their domain name to nebraska.gov and it is very simple.

Chairman McCallum questioned if the county would be gaining anything for the additional \$125 cost for the .gov domain. County Clerk Nancy Scheer responded that the county officials want to simplify the email address and eliminate all the punctuation required to type out the address. She questioned if the hyphen needs to be included in the proposed .gov domain name and Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson responded affirmative. County Clerk Nancy Scheer reported that it is much simpler to give the email and county website over the telephone if the address is full words instead of a series of abbreviations or includes punctuation marks. In addition, she explained that full words are easier for people to understand over the telephone instead of trying to spell out the entire email address because it is a series of abbreviations.

Commissioner Klein questioned if the website domain name could be changed at a reduced cost if it is changed to a domain with the extension of .com or .org. Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson estimated that the cost for a domain name with .com or .org would be \$20 annually. He stated that it makes the most sense to use the simplest domain possible. Planning and Zoning Administrator responded that if the county desires to apply for a domain name with .org or .com extension, he would complete the application form. He stated that one advantage to having the current domain name of co.madison.ne.us is that many counties in Nebraska are using this same configuration; however, he explained that the former domain address name would be available for several years after a new domain name is implemented. Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson recommended that he research options available to the county and the county officials could make a decision on the desired domain name.

After discussion, it was moved by Uhlir and seconded by Klein to authorize Planning and Zoning Administrator John Johnson to complete an application to change the Madison County website domain name to one that is agreed upon by the county officials. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCallum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.

The Board reviewed an email request from Kitcki Carroll, Director of Community Services for Lutheran Family Services of Nebraska, Inc., requesting the funding appropriation from Madison County for the New American Center for the 2008-2009 fiscal year. In addition, they reviewed a letter received from Mr. Kitcki advising that on February 1, 2009, Lutheran Family Services ceased providing immigration legal services in Norfolk. Chairman McCallum reported that he attempted to call the New American Center office located in Norfolk and the telephone was disconnected.

After discussion, motion was made by Klein and seconded by Uhlir to deny the claim payable to New American Center, for funding for the 2009-2009 fiscal year in the amount of \$10,000.00, due to the closure of the Norfolk office on February 1, 2009. Roll call vote: Ayes, McCallum, Uhlir, and Klein. Nays, none. Motion carried.
