

## COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

Madison, Nebraska

February 23, 2016

The Board of County Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska met in regular session at 9:30 A.M.

Advance notice of meeting was published in the Thursday, February 18, 2016 edition of The Norfolk Daily News and posted on the Madison County website. A copy of said notice was provided to each Board member. An affidavit of acknowledgment of receipt of notice of meeting as published was executed.

Following a moment of Silence and the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, Chairman Jim Prauner called the meeting to order and notified the public of the copy of the Open Meetings Act posted in the meeting room.

Present: Commissioners Christian Ohl, Jim Prauner, and Ron Schmidt, County Clerk Nancy Scheer, and road foremen Don Eucker and Jeff Schroeder. Norfolk Daily News reporter Jerry Guenther, US92 reporter Chris Whitney, and WJAG reporter Susan Risinger were present until 10:08 A.M. County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson was present until 11:12 A.M.

Chairman Prauner read the following consent agenda items into the record:

Motion was made by Ohl and seconded by Schmidt to approve the consent agenda. Roll call vote: Ayes, Ohl, Prauner, and Schmidt. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Ohl and seconded by Schmidt to remove item #15 for discussion and/or action on emergency protective custody bills at the request of County Attorney Joseph Smith and approve the regular agenda as amended. Roll call vote: Ayes, Ohl, Prauner, and Schmidt. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Extension Educator Lee Sherry introduced Leo Gonzalez and explained that Mr. Gonzalez is the most recent Educator to join the Extension staff. Ms. Sherry reported that Mr. Gonzalez has been working in Madison County for the past 15 years in various capacities, including working with the TRIO Program, and during the last three years he worked at the Extension Office in a position funded by a grant. She explained that effective July 1st, Mr. Gonzalez will be assigned to Madison County on a permanent basis. She stated that Mr. Gonzalez is bilingual and has been working with under-served populations his entire career. She reported that he is originally from Miami and graduated from Wayne State College where he was recruited to play football.

Mr. Gonzalez reported that he has been working with the University of Nebraska for the last 15 years and for the Extension Division for the last ten years. He stated that he works with the Five Star Leadership Program which provides support to low income first generation students in Madison and Norfolk Public Schools. He explained that the main goal is to increase the rate that students enroll and graduate from post-secondary schools, and provide tools, resources, and self-confidence to graduate with a four-year degree. He explained that the program's goals are to change behaviors, help students improve study skills, find scholarships, prepare for ACT tests, provide college tours, and take students to leadership conferences.

Mr. Gonzalez reported that over the past two years, the students participating in the program have earned close to \$750,000 in scholarships. He said that students are attending colleges throughout the State of Nebraska and scholarships pay for tuition and books. He stated that many different resources are used to put together financial packages for the students. He explained that he is at the schools every day, after school tutoring is provided, and workshops are held to assist with completing scholarship applications. He reported that he is in Madison High School on Tuesdays and Thursdays and in Norfolk Public School on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Mr. Gonzalez reported that the students are involved in community service projects, including a recent project of packaging 3,600 Mercy Meals for homeless children. He stated that the students give back to the community because they know that participating in the Five Star Leadership Program is a privilege. He reported that last year 43 of the 44 seniors went on to college and 41 of the 44 students are currently enrolled. He reported that in 2014 and 2015 a total of 13 students were recipients of the Susan Buffet Scholarship which is full tuition for five years. He stated that students also received scholarships from Tyson and Teammates.

Mr. Gonzalez reported that he holds numerous meetings during evening hours with students and parents to assist with completion of FAFSA forms which is Free Application for Federal Student Aid, applications for PELL grants, and scholarship forms. He stated that he takes phone calls and text messages at all times to provide assistance. Ms. Sherry explained that Mr. Gonzalez is available as a mentor for both the students and parents and that part of his job is to mentor the parents since they don't have any idea how to overcome obstacles to get their children to college. She explained that Mr. Gonzalez holds the students accountable so they make the right choices to get to college.

Commissioner Schmidt asked if students are eligible if one of their parents has a college degree and Mr. Gonzalez responded that low income or first generation students are eligible to participate in the program. Commissioner Ohl asked how students are recruited to the program and Mr. Gonzalez responded that he has recruiting sessions when schools host parents' night and works with the public school administration in both Norfolk and Madison. He stated that they work with students who need help with the process, but at the same time have motivation to want to attend college to further their education. He reported that parents who have heard about the program come up to him and ask how to get their child into the program; so, there is a variety of methods to select students for the program. Commissioner Ohl said the Mr. Gonzalez is very approachable and encouraging.

Ms. Sherry explained that one goal of the program is to get a child who wants to go to college into the program. She stated that they don't want to be wasting their time with students who don't have motivation to get an education. Commissioner Ohl stated that the two-year programs offered at Northeast Community College are outstanding.

Commissioner Ohl asked how students determine which college is best for them and Mr. Gonzalez responded that he takes students on college tours. Mr. Gonzalez explained that in March he will take about 50 freshman students from Madison and Norfolk for a college visit to the University of Nebraska. He said that college visits provide information about what colleges have to offer. He explained that at the beginning of the senior year, he requires students to apply to five schools so they have financing and scholarship options at multiple colleges. He reported that most of his senior students have been accepted to three to five different colleges and then can proceed to the next level of completing scholarship applications and making decisions on registration and housing.

Ms. Sherry reported that Mr. Gonzalez is available to students who have graduated from high school, so he doesn't stop mentoring when the students move on to college. She explained that there are students attending Northeast Community College who meet with Mr. Gonzalez because their parents haven't attended college and can't assist with advising their children.

Chairman Prauner asked if the Five Star Leadership Program is available to students in Tilden, Newman Grove, or Battle Creek and Mr. Gonzalez responded that he currently has 59 students from 7th through 12th grade enrolled in the program, so he can't assist others. Ms. Sherry explained that many of the students are also part of the 4-H program so they want to give these participants an opportunity to do other things in the community.

Commissioner Prauner asked what the biggest obstacle is for students in the program and Mr. Gonzalez responded that number one is the lack of money. Mr. Gonzalez explained that the students need to work hard and do a great job academically so they are eligible for scholarships. He stated that another obstacle is the mindset that students can go to college and be successful. He stated that he is a first generation college graduate who grew up in a single parent home.

Commissioner Ohl asked if the need for this program was determined to be greater in Norfolk and Madison than in the other schools in the County. Ms. Sherry said that there aren't funds available to expand the program and Mr. Gonzalez can't handle any more students. She stated that the University is looking at adding this same type of program in Schuyler and Columbus so Mr. Gonzalez will mentor someone to establish this program.

Ms. Sherry reported that they will need additional funds in the budget for mileage in the next fiscal year budget. She asked the Board to consider purchasing a County car for Extension staff to use instead of submitting mileage claims. She stated that several counties have done this and she offered to submit budget projections. Chairman Prauner stated that they could look at vehicles that the Sheriff's office is no longer using and Ms. Sherry responded that she looked at this option last year; however, the Sheriff didn't recommend keeping any of last year's vehicles for use in another department.

Commissioners thanked the Extension Educators for their presentation.

No action was taken.

Commissioner Schmidt reported that 15 bids were received for a used excavator for the road department. He reported that six different companies submitted proposals and he expressed appreciation for the time and effort for the proposals. He stated that he looked at the current and future needs of the County. He stated that the excavator that the County purchases will likely be used by the County for the next 20 years. He reported that he considered machine warranty, number of hours, the budget, and made a determination about what is the best value for the County. Commissioner Schmidt recommended accepting the bid submitted by Dennis Kuchar of Madison for a 2007 Doosan excavator.

Chairman Prauner asked who provides service for Doosan equipment and Commissioner Schmidt responded that a company in Omaha and Nebraska Track Service in Madison work on Doosan equipment. Commissioner Ohl asked what factors lead to this recommendation and Commissioner Schmidt responded that this machine had a lower number of hours and is bigger than the other used machines. He said that he was worried about hauling the excavator legally; however, he has this issue worked out. He reiterated that the bids were very competitive, but he feels that this machine is the best value for the County.

A motion was made by Schmidt and seconded by Ohl to accept the bid submitted by Dennis Kuchar of Madison for the purchase of a 2007 Doosan, Model 225LC, for a bid price of \$85,000. Roll call vote: Ayes, Ohl, Prauner, and Schmidt. Nays, none. Motion carried.
