Advance notice of meeting was published in the Thursday, March 6, 2014 edition of The Norfolk Daily News. A copy of said notice was mailed to each Board member. An affidavit of acknowledgment of receipt of notice of meeting as published was executed. Chairman Christian Ohl called the meeting to order and notified the public of the location of the information regarding the Open Meeting Act posted in the meeting room.

Present: Commissioners Lee Klein, Jerry McCallum, and Christian Ohl, County Assessor Jeff Hackerott, and County Clerk Nancy Scheer.

Motion made by McCallum and seconded by Klein to approve the agenda for the meeting. Roll call vote: Ayes, Klein, McCallum, and Ohl. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Motion made by Klein and seconded by McCallum to approve the minutes of the February 11, 2014 meeting. Roll call vote: Ayes, Klein, McCallum, and Ohl. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Chairman Ohl opened a public hearing at 9:02 A.M. to receive testimony regarding the following motor vehicle exemption applications:

COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

Madison, Nebraska

March 11, 2014

The Board of County Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska met in regular session at 9:30 A.M.

Advance notice of meeting was published in the Thursday, March 6, 2014 edition of The Norfolk Daily News. A copy of said notice was mailed to each Board member. An affidavit of acknowledgment of receipt of notice of meeting as published was executed. Chairman Lee Klein called the meeting to order and notified the public of the location of the information regarding the Open Meeting Act posted in the meeting room.

Present: Commissioners Lee Klein, Jerry McCallum, and Christian Ohl, County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson, Assistant County Highway Superintendent Dave Heggemeyer, County Clerk Nancy Scheer, Norfolk Daily News reporter Jerry Guenther, US92 reporter Andrew Rogers, and WJAG reporter Paul Hughes.

Chairman Klein read the following consent agenda items into the record:

- 1) Approval of minutes of the February 25, 2014 meeting
- 2) Authorization to advertise for bids and set the bid opening date for April 3, 2014 for the following asphaltic concrete overlay projects:
 - a. Project No. C-59-840 - 822½ Road beginning at 534th Avenue and running East 1.4 miles to 1 mile West of Newman Grove
 - b. Project No. C-59-805 - On 539th Avenue between 834th and 835th Roads, approximately 7 miles South of Meadow Grove
 - c. Project No. C-59-840 - On 539th Avenue between 835th and 836th Roads, approximately 6 miles South of Meadow Grove
 - d. Project No. C-59-769 - On Omaha Avenue from West City limits South to Broken Bridge Road, then South on Broken Bridge Road approximately ½ mile

3) **RESOLUTION #2014-14**

WHEREAS, Check No. 14020049, dated February 11, 2014, and drawn on the General Fund in the amount of eighty nine dollars (\$89.00), was made payable to Hampton Inn Kearney, 118 3rd Avenue, Kearney, Nebraska 68845, and, WHEREAS, said check was not tendered, but remains in the possession of the Madison County Clerk, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Check No. 14020049, dated February 11, 2014, and drawn on the General Fund in the amount of eighty nine dollars (\$89.00), is hereby cancelled.

4) **RESOLUTION #2014-15**

WHEREAS, the 2013-2014 fiscal year budget, adopted by the Board of Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska, commits up to \$2,265,562.00 from the Federal Aid Secondary Fund to pay for expenditures exceeding monies available in the Road/Bridge Fund; and

WHEREAS, monies in the Road/Bridge Fund are now insufficient to meet the current expenditures approved by the Board of Commissioners;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) be transferred from Federal Aid Secondary Fund to Road/Bridge Fund to meet current expenditures.

Motion was made by Ohl and seconded by McCallum to approve the consent agenda. Roll call vote: Ayes, Klein, McCallum, and Ohl. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Ohl and seconded by McCallum to approve the regular agenda. Roll call vote: Ayes, Klein, McCallum, and Ohl. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Sydney Hurley, Executive Director of the Animal Shelter of Northeast Nebraska, gave a presentation regarding a capital campaign for the shelter. Ms. Hurley reported that the Animal Shelter of Northeast Nebraska has been organized since 1995 and became a non-profit organization in 2001. She explained that recently the organization decided to construct an animal shelter facility. She reported that 4.5 acres of land were donated to the organization and it is located along Highway 81 north of the city of Norfolk. She explained that the shelter will try to service a 13 county area because within a 60 mile radius of Norfolk there is not an animal shelter or humane society available to the public.

Ms. Hurley reported that the organization receives calls on a daily basis on animals in the area that need help, but they need to send them away because they are completely operating through a foster care program at the current time. She explained that they currently have 15 active foster families who open up their homes for animals coming off the street, which is wonderful; however, it doesn't give the organization an opportunity to service the area that they would like. She stated that this is one reason why they made a decision to construct a shelter. She reported that the budget for the building is \$1.5 million and they are using Beckenhauer Construction. She explained that the building is 6,300 square feet and will be able to house 35 dogs and 35 cats, which is the maximum number allowed by their permit.

Ms. Hurley stated that the reason she came before the Board of Commissioners is to ask for the Boards' support in their capital campaign. She stated that she has numerous letters of support included in the packet she handed out. She explained that since Madison County will be the largest area that will be serviced, she is trying to talk to people to obtain letters of support.

Commissioner Ohl questioned what the timeline is for construction of the shelter. Mr. Hurley responded that, as of January 2014, the organization has raised a little less than \$500,000 and have had some substantial personal and professional pledges since that time; but, the organization is trying to raise 75% of the funds before actually beginning construction of the facility. She explained that the organization is also creating an endowment fund to provide for the first several years of operating expenses. She stated that the construction timeframe for the facility is based upon funding because the organization does not want to start something that can't be finished. She reiterated that the organization is completely funded with donations, but they charge for adoption fees.

Chairman Klein stated that that he doesn't see any problem with the County Board writing a letter of support. He said that the organization has a very interesting Board of Directors.

After discussion, it was moved by McCallum and seconded by Ohl to provide a letter supporting the Animal Shelter of Northeast Nebraska. Roll call vote: Ayes, Klein, McCallum, and Ohl. Nays, none. Motion carried.

County Clerk Nancy Scheer reported that Dan Osborne, sales representative for Topkote, Inc. called to advise that he was sick and unable to attend the meeting. Commissioner McCallum stated that he doesn't think that Topkote has a 24 foot distributor and the company's equipment requires two passes over a road, creates overlaps in seams, and leaves open spots that require the road to be closed twice as long as needed. Chairman Klein stated that the bid specifications require a 24 foot distributor which should stay in the specifications.

No action was taken.

Chairman Klein stated that a bid opening was held on March 6, 2014 for asphaltic materials. Commissioner McCallum reported that he attended the bid opening and three companies submitted proposals. He explained that Jebro Inc. submitted the low bid on CRS-2P and CRS2 products and Martin Resources Management Corp dba Monarch Oil submitted the low bid on CSS-1H.

County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson reported that he spoke with Steve Walenz from Monarch Oil and the company would like to be awarded a contract for the CSS-1H product.

After discussion, it was moved by McCallum and seconded by Ohl to award a contract to Jebro for CRS-2P and CRS2 products and to also award a contract to Martin Resources Management Corporation dba Monarch Oil for CSS-1H products for the period beginning April 1, 2014 through September 30, 2014. Roll call vote: Ayes, Klein, McCallum, and Ohl. Nays, none. Motion carried.
