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A RESOLUTION GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR CERTAIN LAND LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF MADISON, NEBRASKA UNDER AUTHORITY GRANTED BY THE MADISON COUNTY ZONING AND SUBDIVISION RESOLUTION AND LEGISLATIVE BILL 186 (1978)

WHEREAS, a recommendation has been received from the Madison County Joint Planning Commission and

WHEREAS, notice of public hearing was published in the July 25, 2025, edition of The Norfolk Daily News, and a public hearing was held by law.

WHEREAS, the Madison County Joint Planning Commission and the Madison County Board of Commissioners have established the following Statement of Finding of Facts:

1. The application is consistent with the Madison County Comprehensive Plan.
2. The application is consistent with the Madison County Zoning and Subdivision Regulations.
3. The Elkhorn Valley Sportsman Club has been in operation since 1982 and began operating at the current location in 2020 with no complaints received.
4. The club will be for members only and provides youth and school programs.
5. Will consist of only shotguns.
6. This is an Ag Transitional zoning district and is an allowable use with a Conditional Use Permit.
7. A compliance letter from the appropriate agency has been provided to the Zoning Administrator verifying gun range sites follow existing standards.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska, hereby grants a Conditional Use Permit to Elkhorn Valley Sportsman Club to operate a trap and skeet shooting range on property described as:

The W ½ of the NE ¼ of Section 33, Township 22 North, Range 1 West of the 6th P.M., Madison County, Nebraska

This Conditional Use Permit shall be subject to the following conditions in addition to those established with the Madison County Zoning and Subdivision regulations:

1. This is a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Trap and Skeet Shooting Range for a period of 5 years and will be renewed automatically with no verifiable complaints.
2. The hours of operation will be Monday through Thursday from 8:00 am until 10:00 pm and Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 am until 6:00 pm.
3. This permit is subject to the Madison County Zoning and Subdivision Regulations, the laws of Nebraska, and the U.S. Government.
4. This permit is to allow shotguns only.
5. This permit requires an annual PH test of the location of the gun range that will be provided to the zoning administrator.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon taking effect of this Resolution, the above Conditional Use Permit shall be entered and shown on the Official Zoning Map of Madison County, previously adopted by reference, and said zoning map is hereby reincorporated as a part of the Madison County, Nebraska Zoning and Subdivision Resolution as amended.

Pursuant to published legal notice in Friday, July 25, 2025, edition of the Norfolk Daily News, Chairman Troy Uhlir opened a public hearing at 10:04 A.M. to receive public comments concerning the Conditional Use Permit renewal application of Brent Weitfeld to spread bio-solids on pasture ground from the City of Norfolk Wastewater Treatment Plant located in the E ½ of the E ½ of Section 24, Township 23 North, Range 1 West of the 6th P.M., Madison County, Nebraska. The property is located south of the City of Norfolk approximately at the intersection of 837th Road and 558th Avenue. Parcel ID# 590159747.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Heather McWhorter stated that this is a renewal of a CUP approved in 2020. No complaints have been received. Ms. McWhorter would recommend reapproval based on the above facts utilizing the above conditions for both locations. No opposition to this location and Planning voted unanimously to recommend approval.

RESOLUTION #2025-38

A RESOLUTION GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR CERTAIN LAND LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF MADISON, NEBRASKA UNDER AUTHORITY GRANTED BY THE MADISON COUNTY ZONING AND SUBDIVISION RESOLUTION AND LEGISLATIVE BILL 186 (1978)

WHEREAS a recommendation has been received from the Madison County Joint Planning Commission and

WHEREAS notice of public hearing was published in the July 25, 2025 edition of The Norfolk Daily News, and a public hearing was held by law.

WHEREAS, the Madison County Joint Planning Commission and the Madison County Board of Commissioners have established the following Statement of Finding of Facts:

1. This application is consistent with the Madison County Comprehensive Plan, Zoning and Subdivision Regulations and the Zoning Map.
2. The property is zoned A2 General Agriculture.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska, hereby grant a Conditional Use Permit to Brent Weitfeld to spread bio-solids on pasture ground from the City of Norfolk Wastewater Treatment Plant on property described as:

The E ½ of the E ½ of Section 24, Township 23 North, Range 1 West of the 6th P.M., Madison County, Nebraska.

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This Conditional Use Permit shall be subject to the following conditions in addition to those established with the Madison County Zoning and Subdivision regulations:

1. This Conditional Use Permit shall be for a period of five (5) years from the date of this resolution or with a change in ownership of the property. Automatic renewal with no verifiable complaints.
2. There will be no storage of sludge on the property.
3. Spreading may occur year-round.
4. The City of Norfolk shall be solely responsible for the safe delivery and legal application of the stabilized wastewater solids to the property described in this permit.
5. By allowing the City of Norfolk to apply stabilized wastewater solids to the property described in this permit, the landowner assumes sole responsibility for the material applied by the city.
6. There will be no spreading of sludge within 500 feet of a neighbor’s residence.
7. Sludge shall not be applied at a rate greater than the recommended agronomic rate based on crop type and soils.
8. Annual soil testing shall be done to ensure the application does not exceed the agronomic rate, and the annual soil test results shall be submitted to the Madison County Zoning Administrator annually. If excess nitrogen is detected, application at this location shall cease until reserve nitrogen levels have been reduced to allow applications of solids at an agronomic rate.
9. No sludge may be applied into standing water.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon taking effect of this Resolution, the above Conditional Use Permit shall be entered and shown on the Official Zoning Map of Madison County, previously adopted by reference, and said zoning map is hereby reincorporated as a part of the Madison County, Nebraska Zoning and Subdivision Resolution as amended.

Motion made by Stinson and seconded by Schmidt to the Conditional Use Permit renewal application of Brent Weitfeld to spread bio-solids on pasture ground from the City of Norfolk Wastewater Treatment Plant located in the E ½ of the E ½ of Section 24, Township 23 North, Range 1 West of the 6th P.M., Madison County, Nebraska. The property is located south of the City of Norfolk approximately at the intersection of 837th Road and 558th Avenue. Parcel ID# 590159747. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt, Stinson, and Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Public Defender Matthew Headley appeared before the Board to address the status of the petty cash account maintained by the Public Defender’s Office. He reported that, based upon the lack of use of the account, he is requesting that it be closed. He noted that the petty cash account was originally established through a claim presented to and approved by the Madison County Board of Commissioners in 2018 or prior. Mr. Headley provided a detailed breakdown of the expenditures made from the account during the time it was active. Mr. Headley further advised that the current balance of the account is \$50.64. This amount was delivered to County Clerk Anne Pruss on July 29, 2025. Following discussion, Mr. Headley requested that the Board of Commissioners consider closing the petty cash account of the Public Defender’s Office and transferring the remaining balance into the General Fund.

Motion made by Stinson and seconded by Schmidt to dissolve the petty cash fund for the Public Defender’s function originally established in the amount of \$59.75 and to authorize the removal of the fund from the County’s financial records upon confirmation that all funds have been reconciled and returned to the County Treasurer. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt and Stinson. Nays, none. Motion carried.

The Board of County Commissioners discussed the ongoing contract and compensation structure for the firm Moyer & Moyer, which provides legal representation for indigent criminal defendants. Ron Schmidt asked how the proposed salary arrangement would work with ongoing casework and the submission of claims, noting that some cases had historically resulted in significant monthly payments from the county. Commissioner Eric Stinson and County Clerk Anne Pruss clarified that while the firm would now receive a fixed salary of \$8,500 per month, totaling \$102,000 annually, claims for extraordinary expenses such as depositions and expert witnesses could still be submitted through a designated county line item.

Mr. Moyer raised concerns about tracking workload, noting that he currently averages approximately 11 hours per case for about 89 appointed cases, and questioned how this would be reconciled under a salary system. County Clerk Anne Pruss recommended maintaining detailed internal records of cases and hours worked for reporting purposes, but confirmed that monthly billing to the county for routine services would no longer be necessary. Commissioner Eric Stinson suggested that Moyer & Moyer submit updates at least quarterly to prevent surprises regarding case volume or workload.

The Board agreed to make the salary arrangement for \$120,000 per fiscal year, retroactive to July 1, 2025, reconciling payments already made under the prior system. Commissioners Ron Schmidt and Eric Stinson discussed adjusting for any prior payments so that Moyer & Moyer would receive the correct total for the fiscal year. County Anne Pruss confirmed that the contract would formally take effect July 1, 2025, aligning with the fiscal year, and that the arrangement would be reassessed during the FY 2026-2027 budget cycle. Commissioners agreed to postpone approval agreement until August 26, 2025 Board of Commissioners meeting.

Motion made by Uhlir and seconded by Stinson to table contract for compensation structure for the firm Moyer & Moyer, which provides legal representation for indigent criminal defendants until August 26, 2025. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt and Stinson. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Chairman Troy Uhlir reported on discussions regarding the Behavioral Health Specialists (BHS) bond. Aaron Otten, President of Elkhorn Valley Bank & Trust stated that Article V of the Loan Agreement outlines requirements related to financial reporting and debt service coverage. As the issuer, Madison County is responsible for triggering the financial reporting covenant by requesting audited financial statements pursuant to Section 5.01 (Reporting Requirements). In addition, a compliance certificate demonstrating the Debt Service Coverage Ratio, as required under Section 5.12 (Rents and Charges; Debt Service Coverage), is to be delivered along with the audited financial statements within 180 days of fiscal year end. Mr. Otten noted that BHS has been transparent and has provided in-house financials; however, given that the County is the issuer and there are three banks involved in the lending group

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(Elkhorn Valley Bank, Madison County Bank, and Security First Bank), it would be prudent for the County to formally request the financial reporting as required under the terms of the loan agreement. Concerns were expressed regarding BHS’s financial difficulties and the need to ensure compliance with the covenants that require the issuer, Madison County, to obtain and provide financial information to the lenders.

Motion made by Stinson and seconded by Schmidt to direct the borrower, Behavioral Health Specialists, Inc., at its expense, to retain an independent consultant to make a report and recommendations with respect to rates, fees, charges, method of operation, and other factors affecting the financial condition of the borrower, in order to increase net revenues available for debt service to a level that will produce a debt service coverage ratio of at least 1.15 to 1. A copy of the independent consultant’s report and recommendations, if any, shall be filed with the borrower and the lender. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt and Stinson. Abstaining, Uhlir (due to service on the Behavioral Health Board). Nays, none. Motion carried.

County Clerk Anne Pruss reported that the regular agenda item regarding Bryan LGH medical expenses would need to be tabled until the August 26, 2025, Board of Commissioners meeting to allow County Attorney Joe Smith additional time to further discuss the matter with the Board.

Motion made the Schmidt and seconded by Stinson to table the agenda item until August 26, 2025. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt and Stinson. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Chairman Troy Uhlir reported that the Village of Meadow Grove expressed willingness to sell Property ID No. 590032925 for the expansion of Road District #3 maintenance yard. The matter was discussed by the Board of Commissioners.

Motion was made by Commissioner Stinson and seconded by Commissioner Schmidt to look into purchasing Property ID No. 590032925 from the Village of Meadow Grove for the purpose of expanding the Road District #3 maintenance yard.

All elected and appointed officials met with the Board of Commissioners to review and discuss the budgets that had been submitted by each office. The Board of Commissioners reviewed expenditures with each office and made recommendations for either reducing or increasing budget requests to better align with prior years’ expenditures. The Budget Committee provided updated proposed budget documents to the Board for further discussion and review.

County Clerk Anne Pruss reminded the Board of Commissioners that the Public Hearing for the 2025–2026 Fiscal Year Budget is scheduled for Tuesday, August 26, 2025, at 6:00 P.M. in the Commissioners Meeting Room. The hearing will be open to the public.

No action taken.

County Clerk Anne Pruss reported that pending litigation for CIR Case 1575 (Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #94) would need to be tabled until the August 26, 2025, Board of Commissioners meeting to allow Sarah Carstensen, Woods & Aitkens additional time to further discuss the matter with the Board.

Motion made the Schmidt and seconded by Stinson to table the agenda item until August 26, 2025. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt and Stinson. Nays, none. Motion carried.
