COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

Madison, Nebraska

March 24, 2026

The Board of County Commissioners of Madison County, Nebraska met in regular session at 9:30 A.M.

Advanced notice of meeting was published in the Wednesday, March 18, 2026 edition of the Norfolk Daily News. A copy of said notice was mailed to each Board member. An affidavit of acknowledgment of receipt of notice of meeting as published was executed.

Following a moment of Silence and the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, Chairman Troy Uhlir called the meeting to order and notified the public of the copy of the Open Meetings Act posted in the meeting room.

Present: Commissioners Ron Schmidt, Eric Stinson, and Troy Uhlir, County Clerk Anne Pruss, County Highway Superintendent Richard Johnson, County Attorney Joe Smith, Deputy County Attorney. Matthew Keirnan, Veterans Administrator, Gregg Hanson, County Surveyor LaVern Schroeder, Noxious Weed Superintendent Don Svitak, Public Defender Matthew Headley, County Sheriff Todd Volk, & six citizens.

Commissioner Schmit read the following consent agenda items into the record:

- 1) Approval of minutes of March 10, 2026 meeting
- 2) Authorization to advertise for bids for culvert pipe for 2026-2027 fiscal year
- 3) Authorization to advertise for grader blades for 2026-2027 fiscal year
- 4) Authorization to advertise for armor coat and road gravel for 2026-2027 fiscal year

Resolution #2026-14

WHEREAS, Check No. 26020207, dated February 24, 2026, and drawn on the General Fund in the amount of twenty-five dollars and twenty-six cents (\$25.26), was made payable to Douglas County Sheriff's Office, 3601 North 156th Street, Omaha, Nebraska 68116, and

WHEREAS, County Attorney, has formally requested cancellation of the payment after discovering that the check was duplication of payment to party;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Check No. 26020207, dated February 24, 2026, and drawn on the General Fund in the amount of twenty-five dollars and twenty-six cents (\$25.26), is hereby cancelled.

Motion made by Schmidt and seconded by Stinson to approve the consent agenda for the meeting. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt, Stinson, and Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

Motion made by Stinson and seconded by Schmidt to approve the regular agenda for the meeting. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt, Stinson, and Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

County Surveyor LaVern Schroeder provided an overview of statutory responsibilities, noting that duties include maintaining and setting section corners as required by state statute. Additional work outside of statutory requirements is performed only upon direction of the Board.

The Surveyor reported that since 2022, work has been limited to statutory obligations as directed by the Board. A map identifying maintained and established corners was presented. The Surveyor explained the use of GPS and state plane coordinates in locating and reestablishing corners.

Discussion was held regarding safety practices while working on roadways. The Surveyor indicated that traffic cones are used and insurance guidance previously confirmed adequacy. A Commissioner recommended the use of high-visibility safety jackets. The Surveyor agreed to incorporate this recommendation.

Further discussion included coordination with road departments prior to construction projects to identify and preserve section corners. It was noted that pre-identification reduces time and cost for reestablishment.

No action taken.

Noxious Weed Superintendent Don Svitak presented the annual evaluation report from the Nebraska Department of Agriculture. The program is evaluated on inspections, office procedures, reporting, and continuing education. The County received a perfect score of 3400 points with no deficiencies noted.

Motion made by Stinson and seconded by Schmidt to acknowledge receipt of Nebraska Department of Agriculture Noxious Weed Control Act. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt, Stinson, and Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

The Board discussion was held regarding establishing a formal policy for documentation and reimbursement of employee travel, training, and related expenses. The County Clerk explained the need for a written policy to ensure compliance with audit requirements, including documentation of travel purpose, location, and expenses. Proposed additions included use of mapping documentation to verify travel routes.

Concerns were raised by department officials regarding confidentiality and practicality, particularly for case-related travel without formal agendas. Discussion included possible use of case numbers or initials to maintain confidentiality while providing documentation. Additional concerns included clarification of meal reimbursements, mileage calculations, and lodging procedures, including tax-exempt status and direct billing.

Due to the need for further review and input, the Board agreed additional revisions were necessary.

Motion made by Stinson and seconded by Schmidt to table until April 7, 2026 to further discuss policy establishing documentation and reimbursement requirements for employee travel, training, continuing education, conferences, and other county-related business, and acknowledgment of receipt by affected employee. Roll call vote: Ayes, Schmidt, Stinson, and Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

County Sheriff Todd Volk reported increased juvenile detention costs, noting current expenditures exceed projections due to higher detainee counts and extended stays. The County Clerk Anne Pruss advised that, per guidance from the State Auditor, budget adjustments should be handled on a month-to-month basis rather than increasing overall budget authority.

After discussion, the following resolution was introduced:

RESOLUTION #2026-15

WHEREAS, due to unforeseen circumstances, proposed expenditures exceed budget authority allocated for the Juvenile Detention 680 Function in the General Fund, and

WHEREAS, sufficient budget authority exists within the General Function, also within the General Fund, to allow for a transfer to meet current fiscal year expenditures for the Juvenile Detention 680 Function,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners that an additional eighteen thousand nine hundred and forty-five dollars and zero cents (\$18, 945.00) of budget authority is hereby transferred from the Miscellaneous General function to the Juvenile Detention function within the General Fund.

Motion was made by Schmidt and seconded by Stinson that the foregoing resolution be adopted. Roll call vote: Ayes, Stinson, Schmidt, and Uhlir. Nays, none. Motion carried.

The County Clerk/Election Commissioner Anne Pruss provided a comprehensive overview of the procedures, timelines, and statutory requirements associated with the posting of election results for the May 12, 2026 election.

The Clerk presented a comparison of election reporting timelines among counties within the Northeast District, noting that several counties operate as all-mail ballot counties, while others, including Madison County, utilize a combination of polling locations and early voting. It was explained that all-mail counties are permitted to begin processing ballots prior to Election Day, allowing them to report results significantly earlier, often shortly after polls close. In contrast, Madison County cannot begin processing ballots from polling locations until after 8:00 p.m. when polls officially close.

The Clerk outlined the step-by-step process required on election night:

1. **Poll Closing and Reconciliation**

At 8:00 p.m., all polling locations close. Election workers must then reconcile their records by verifying that:

- The number of voter signatures matches the number of ballots issued; and
- The election roster corresponds with the numeric log.

Any discrepancies must be resolved before election workers are permitted to leave the polling site. The Clerk noted that this reconciliation process has taken up to one hour or more in some precincts.

2. **Transport of Election Materials**

Once reconciliation is complete, election workers transport ballots and election materials to the courthouse. Due to geographic distances, some precincts require an additional 20–30 minutes of travel time. As a result, the earliest ballots from polling locations are typically received between approximately 8:40 p.m. and 9:30 p.m.

3. **Check-In and Chain of Custody Procedures**

Upon arrival at the courthouse, all election materials must be formally checked in. This includes:

- Logging the receipt of ballot boxes;
- Verifying seal numbers; and
- Documenting the date, time, and staff responsible for handling each box.

The Clerk noted that recent legislative changes and guidance from the Secretary of State have increased documentation requirements, adding additional time to the process.

4. **Ballot Preparation and Scanning**

Ballots are processed through a “jogger” machine to separate and align them prior to scanning. Ballots are then fed into tabulation machines at an approximate rate of 75 ballots per minute. Based on prior elections with approximately 15,000 ballots, the Clerk estimated that complete tabulation of all ballots could take approximately three and one-half hours under optimal conditions.

5. **Ballot Duplication Process**

If a ballot is rejected by the tabulation machine due to unclear markings, processing must stop. The ballot is then reviewed by a bipartisan resolution board, consisting of one Republican and one Democrat, who duplicate the ballot onto a new ballot. The duplicated ballot is then reprocessed. The Clerk emphasized that this step can significantly delay overall processing time.

6. **Compilation and Reporting of Results**

After ballots are tabulated, results must be:

- Verified for accuracy;
- Uploaded into the election reporting system;
- Generated into official reports; and
- Distributed to multiple entities, including the Nebraska Secretary of State, local media, election reporting systems, and the county website.

The Clerk noted that this reporting process alone can take several minutes per update.

The Clerk further explained that the first results posted at 8:00 p.m. typically include only early voting ballots that have been processed prior to the close of polls. Subsequent updates are dependent upon when precincts report and how quickly ballots can be processed.

The Clerk acknowledged prior delays in reporting and explained that such delays were attributable to a combination of factors, including:

- Late-arriving precincts due to reconciliation issues;
- Technical issues with reporting systems; and
- Time required for ballot duplication and verification processes.

To mitigate these concerns, the Clerk reported that technical support personnel have been scheduled to be available on election night, and additional equipment has been secured in prior years to improve efficiency. The Clerk emphasized that while timely reporting is a goal, accuracy and compliance with state law are the highest priorities. Counties are not required to post incremental results throughout the evening; however, Madison County has historically done so as a courtesy to the public.

The Board discussed public expectations and the importance of communicating differences between all-mail counties and counties with polling locations. It was noted that comparisons between counties can be misleading due to these structural differences.

The Board received the report and expressed appreciation for the detailed explanation provided by the Clerk.

No formal action was taken.

The Board considered a request to proclaim June as Men's Health Month. Discussion was held regarding the Board's general practice on proclamations. Commissioners expressed concern about setting precedent for numerous similar requests.

Motion was made by Schmidt and seconded by Stinson to deny proclamation request. Roll call vote: Ayes, Stinson, Schmidt, and Uhler. Nays, none. Motion carried.
